STEPHEN MINISTRY AT PEACE



Stephen Ministry is a lay-caring ministry being used by more than 13,000 congregations worldwide to increase care and outreach to hurting people. Through Stephen Ministry, our congregation will be able to equip and empower a team of laypeople—Stephen Ministers—who provide one-to-one, Christ-

centered care to people experiencing life difficulties.

Who leads this ministry? Stephen Leaders are trained leaders in our congregation who support and direct our Stephen Ministry. Our current leaders are Pastor Brown and Deaconess Intern Abby Reynolds.

Who provides care? Stephen Ministers are trained congregation members who are carefully selected and guided to provide Christian care to someone who is hurting. Their high-quality training includes topics such as listening, feelings, boundaries, and assertiveness. We will begin Stephen Ministry training next year!

Who can Stephen Ministry help? Care Receivers are recipients of Stephen Ministers' care. They are people from our church or community who are experiencing grief, loss of a job, divorce, loneliness, illness, or other life difficulties. Stephen Ministers meet with their care receivers once a week for about an hour for as long as the care receiver needs it.

LIFE MINISTRY- HERE AM !! SEND ME



Frances Staudt is a 16-year-old student at Tumwater High School in Washington state. In February of this year, she refused to play in a school basketball game because the opposing side had a male player participating. She did not feel safe, especially as she witnessed him using his superior strength to physically bully her teammates on the court. Frances was the only young woman on her team to take a stand against this. Her teammates accused her of trying to draw attention to herself and shrugged off the abuse as "just one game." Apparently, they were just fine with being physically abused in the name of sports.

Frances took her concerns to the school district, which investigated whether she had violated the young man's rights by misgendering him since he was transgender. In response, the Foundation Against Intolerance and Racism (FAIR) has filed a civil rights complaint on her behalf with the U.S. Department of Education arguing for her right to make personal choices regarding athletic competition. Frances has become an advocate for keeping women's sports strictly for women and as a result, has lost many friendships.

Ms. Staudt's story raises a lot of questions. Why aren't the parents of all these young ladies insisting that women's sports be restricted to biological females? Why do the schools apply the term "toxic masculinity" to our boys and young men while pushing transgenderism in school policies? Why are school boards and school districts allowed to trash traditional values at the expense of girls and young women? How did our culture become so degraded?

Sadly, standing up for what is right comes with a price that most people are unwilling to pay. Who wants to lose friends and go through legal hassles? Isn't it easier to just shrug things off and move on? If you lack integrity, the answer is "yes."

The assassination of Charlie Kirk points to how high that cost can be. He was a young man who engaged and inspired the younger generation like no one before him. He challenged colleges regarding the politically correct values they pushed and he won debates in a respectful manner. He encouraged young people to get married, have families and to embrace Jesus as their Savior. He did so with kindness, optimism and energy. Unfortunately, his success made him a target and it cost him his life.

Fortunately, there are a lot of young people like Frances Staudt who have the strength and integrity to stand up for what is right. The overwhelming response to the celebration of life of Charlie Kirk showed how many people want to be a force for good in their communities. It was a source of encouragement in the midst of a culture that has rejected God. One of the Bible verses that inspired Charlie was from Isaiah 6:8. "Here am I! Send me." Let it be a verse that inspires us as well.

St. Trinity Cemetery Entrances

As we approach the 15th anniversary of Peace's ownership of St. Trinity Cemetery, we reflect on the changes to the cemetery entrances over the years. The cemetery currently has two entrances, which we refer to as the "main" or south entrance by the office, and the north entrance near Park Lawn Cemetery. The south entrance was developed in 1953, when the Stunkel farm house was torn down. Prior to that, there was a service road around the house, but slightly north of the current entrance.

The original entrance to the cemetery was in the center of the property, between the two current entrances. In 1927, Lemay Ferry Road was widened and graded to be less hilly. As a consequence, the road was then 10 feet below the entrance. The north stone entrance, with gas lamps on the pillars, was built at this time to accommodate the grade change in Lemay Ferry Road. In the picture below, you will note that the inscription on the right pillar reads "Pilgrims Rest Perpetual Care". In 1917, the cemetery was put under a "perpetual care" arrangement. This means that a portion of every grave sale would be set aside and used to ensure the maintenance and upkeep of the grounds for future use. This practice continues today. Why "Pilgrim's Rest"? In 1927 when the north entrance was built, the east half of current Section 3 was sold to Emmaus Lutheran Church. Emmaus named this section "Pilgrim's Rest." The gas lamps have long since been replaced with a decorative ball, but that name remains on the entrance pillar today as homage to the cemetery's historic past.

LuSo Mock Trial Team traveled to Philadelphia for the Empire Mock Trial competition. The days were packed with matches, competing against teams from across




